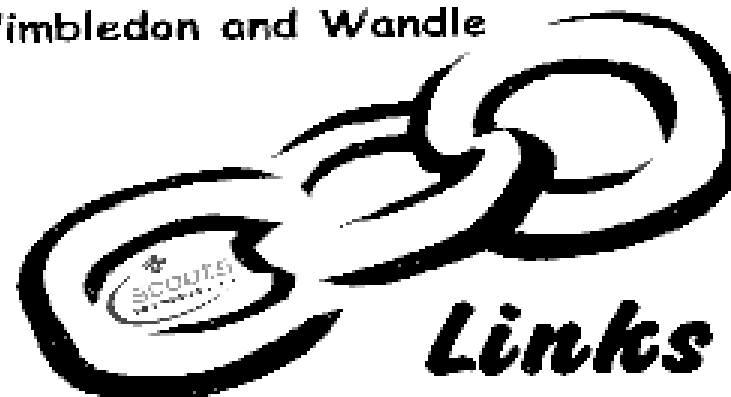

POR is quite clear on the subject - "*It is the responsibility of all adults to ensure that their behavior is appropriate at all times*" and "*adults must not consume alcohol when they are directly responsible for young people on a Scouting activity and must not permit young people (aged under 18 years) to consume alcohol on Scouting activities.*"

## Training - Alison Edwards

Training has been carrying on over the summer holidays and I am pleased to be able to report on 3 more woodbadge awards for the District. Peter Hutton - GSL 13th Wimbledon, Kerry-Ann Inwood - ACSL 6/12th Mitcham and Richard Starke -ASL 9th Wimbledon. For those of you who are still completing your training can I encourage you to get in touch with your Training Advisers as soon as possible and 'get a move on' as they say! We do not have an abundance of Training Advisers to go round so you would help us all tremendously by making contact with them so they can help you complete your training!

I am also letting you know about some free training, for anyone in the District: 8 December 2010, Bow Lane Safeguarding Awareness Training. This 2 hour session will provide you with advice, information and maybe a few helpful hints on issues around safeguarding. It will give you some information on child protection issues and on keeping yourselves as well as the young people you work with safe. The training is open to anyone in the district. It will not cost you anything to attend. However it might be of particular interest to new Leaders, young Leaders aged 14+ (as it is relevant to the YL scheme as well as the adult Leadership scheme) and anyone who feels a bit of 'refresher' training in this area would be valuable.

It will form part of your ongoing learning commitment, which is a requirement for renewal of appointments. This is being offered to all Leaders in the County at a series of events this autumn. You should note of course that the requirement to HAVE DONE safeguarding awareness training in the 'life' of an appointment (5 years) is now a compulsory requirement for renewal of appointments, so this might be a good opportunity!
